Ethical statement guidelines

1. Survey data only

The ALSWH survey program has ongoing ethical approval from the Human Research Ethics Committees (HRECs) of the Universities of Newcastle and Queensland (ref. H-076-0795 and 2004000224, respectively, for the 1973-78, 1946-51 and 1921-26 cohorts; H-2012-0256 and 2012000950, for the 1989-95 cohort; and H-2014-0246 and 2014001213 for the MatCH Substudy).
